

Difference between Summer Flounder (Fluke) & Winter Flounder.

- When the fish is laying flat and facing you, the Winter Flounder (on the left) has eyes more to the right and gills and jaw to the left. Mouth swings open to the left. The Summer flounder (Fluke and on the right) is larger, has prominent teeth, eyes more on the left and gills on the right. The jaw and mouth opens to the right. Any questions, get Beach Master for advice and take a picture for records.

Fluke (Summer Flounder) vs. Sundial

Both are left-eyed flatfish. Fluke (top) maybe out of season in this tournament. Sundial is more diamond shaped. Sundials are also very thin and generally smaller. Fluke are left eyed fish and have teeth. Sundials are also left eyed fish but have no teeth.



If not 100% sure of species it is, ask for your beach master and take a picture.
